At the same time, their share of the total number of police officers, including those on childcare leave, is 21.88%.</p> <p>According to the indicator in the Policy Matrix, at least 15% of officers are women at the end of 2020.</p> <p>If we refer to the share of certified women in the total number of certified employees on the list, then this is represented by a percentage of 17.6%.</p> <p>At the end of 2020, 89 women hold management positions, their number decreasing by 12.7% compared to 2019 and increasing by 17.1% compared to 2017. The decrease is also attested by the share of women holding management positions, being 9.7% (2019-10.9%) of the number of head positions.</p> <p>During 2020, 1130 people were employed (247 - women, 883 - men). The competition was attended by 1032 people (220 women and 812 men), the number of winners of the competition for filling vacancies being 943 including 204 women and 739 men.</p> <p>At the same time, 847 people stopped working (122 - women, 725 - men).</p>

Reassessment of the conditions and procedures for the recruitment and selection of officers and the positions, which may be filled by them</p>	<p>2017–2020</p>	<p>Official statistical data Regarding the share of non-commissioned officers in the Police with positive dynamics</p>	<p>Ministry of Internal Affairs (General Inspectorate of Police)</p>	<p>According to the information on staff, the limit staff of the Police is 9156 positions, out of which 5509 police positions of officers, 3406 police positions of non-commissioned officers, 241 civilian employees.</p> <p>Thus, compared to the 12 months of 2019 (3419 functions of non-commissioned officers), the number of non-commissioned officers decreased by 13 units.</p> <p>As a result, out of 8915 certified positions, 61.8% belong to the officer positions and 38.2% to the non-commissioned officer positions (2019 -38.39%).</p> <p>According to the Policy Matrix, at the end of 2020 this figure will reach a share of 60.0%, the deficit of non-commissioned officer positions being 21.8%.</p> <p>According to the list, the staff is 8042 employees, including 7821 certified employees (4872 police officers' positions, 2949 non-commissioned police officers positions), 221 civilian employees.</p> <p>Thus, the positive dynamics of the share of occupied non-commissioned officer positions is noticed, being 37.7% (2019-35.1%).</p> <p>In order to motivate employees of C01-C03 level, by OMAI no.149 of March 16, 2020 regarding the modification of OMAI no.71/2013, 1733 non-commissioned officer positions were reorganized into senior non-commissioned officer positions.</p> <p>Within the specialized subdivisions of the PGI these reshuffles were carried out gradually by the approval of OMAI no. 197/2020 (INSP, INI, Fulger) and OMAI no. 278/2020 (DATM, DGUP, DCIP, CTCEJ).</p> <p>The strategic vision regarding the inversion of the position pyramid within the MIA and the Methodology regarding the reversal of the position pyramid within the Police, approved by the MIA Provision no. 10/441 of 17.03.2017, highlighted the fact that the change of the officers/non-commissioned officers ratio of 40%/60% implies the annual transition of 675 units from officers to non-commissioned officers. Compared with the analogical period of the previous year the number of verbal processes filed decreased by 64, 4 %. The decrease is also attested in terms of the share of the verbal processes filed out of the total contraventions.</p>
